Now that you have read the patient booklet for the MINT-ACITRETIN and the Pregnancy Prevention Program and talked with your doctor about MINT-ACITRETIN and its risks, please use this self-evaluation exercise to test your understanding of some of the most important points before you sign the informed consent.

- 1 It is very important to prevent pregnancy while taking MINT-ACITRETIN because:

See your doctor as scheduled because it is important for your doctor to see you regularly, preferably every month, when you are taking MINT-ACITRETIN. Blood tests and other tests that your doctor will conduct will allow your doctor to check your response to MINT-ACITRETIN. Seeing your doctor as scheduled also gives you a chance to discuss any concerns you may have.

Avoiding pregnancy during treatment and for three years after taking MINT-ACITRETIN is equally the responsibility of me, my sexual partner, and my doctor.



## 1 b is correct

While a and c are both true, the reason pregnancy prevention is required is because MINT-ACITRETIN can cause birth defects including severe birth defects. MINT-ACITRETIN stays in the body for a long time, so you should not get pregnant for at least 3 years after stopping MINT-ACITRETIN treatment. If you plan on becoming pregnant you should NOT take MINT-ACITRETIN.

# 2 c is correct

It is important to be sure you are not pregnant because MINT-ACITRETIN could harm your developing baby. Your doctor should ensure you are not pregnant by verifying both pregnancy tests have indicated you are not pregnant.

## 3 a is correct

It is important to be sure you have made the right choice of birth control for you and are comfortable and understand how to use them properly. If you and your doctor have decided MINT-ACITRETIN is right for you starting two forms of birth control at least 1 month before MINT-ACITRETIN is required to minimize the risk of pregnancy.

# 4 d is correct

Because MINT-ACITRETIN can remain in your body for a long time after you stop taking the drug, the risk of birth defects continues and you must not get pregnant for at least 3 years after stopping MINT-ACITRETIN.

## 5 b is correct

It is important to avoid alcohol while taking MINT-ACITRETIN and for 2 months after stopping MINT-ACITRETIN because alcohol can change MINT-ACITRETIN into another substance that may also cause birth defects and that lasts in the body for even longer than MINT-ACITRETIN.

## 6 c is correct

Etretinate that can be formed from MINT-ACITRETIN can be present in your body for up to three years after you have stopped using MINT-ACITRETIN. You should avoid donating blood for three years after stopping your MINT-ACITRETIN.

# 7 T is correct

When being treated with MINT-ACITRETIN it is important to discuss your overall health with your doctor and inform him or her of any side effects you may be experiencing as they may be related to your medication.

## 8 F is correct

Only you can truly prevent pregnancy. While your doctor will give you information, refer you to counseling, and encourage you to make the right decision, and your partner's cooperation and support with birth control methods is essential, the success of pregnancy prevention during and after treatment with MINT-ACITRETIN is your responsibility.
